Spain concentrated on building its empire on the central and southern parts of the Americas allotted to it by the Treaty of Tordesillas , because of presence of large, settled societies like the Aztec , the Inca , the Maya and the Muisca , whose human and material resources it could exploit, and large concentrations of silver and gold. Allies Zapata and Villa took Mexico City in March , but found themselves outside of their elements in the capital and withdrew to their respective bastions. This network was made up of two main north-south roads, one running along the Pacific coast and another through the Andes. Independence destroyed the old common market that existed under the Spanish Empire after the Bourbon Reforms and created an increased dependence on the financial investment provided by nations which had already begun to industrialize ; therefore, Western European powers, in particular Great Britain and France, and the United States began to play major roles, since the region became economically dependent on these nations. The Spanish conquistadors committed savage acts of violence against the natives. Individuals and families face increasing job insecurity, lower wage s, and a reduction in social services such as electricity and water. Weak physical infrastructure in the face of geographical constraints acts as a tax on trade. All shared an isolation from the great mass of humanity inhabiting Eurasia and Africa, who were in some way in contact with one another. Many industries are now more efficient producers of resources such as steel. These phases are linked to short-term extreme precipitation events in the plains of central Argentina. The development of the SAMS during spring is characterised by a rapid southward shift of the convective region from northwestern South America to the highland region of the central Andes and to the southern Amazon basin. The Andes effect reinforces the strength of the Chaco Low as an orographic barrier. The indigenous peoples were greatly varied, far more so than the Europeans; they were spread over a vast area and only faintly aware of each other from one major region to the next. Zapata was assassinated on April 10, This elite looked towards other Catholic European modelsâ€”in particular Franceâ€”for a new Latin American culture, but did not seek input from indigenous peoples. Urbanization and industrialization are also destroying the unique biome s of South America. Argentina's first constitution was drafted in and a national government was established in In the first decades of the twentieth century, there were several military incursions into Central America and the Caribbean, mostly in defense of commercial interests, which became known as the " Banana Wars. It is a source of intra-seasonal variability affecting South America that seems to be related to a combination of tropical circulation changes and midlatitude Rossby wave trains that propagate into South America. Today, mestizos make up large parts of the populations of many South American countries, such as Paraguay 95 percent , Ecuador 65 percent , and Colombia 58 percent. Economics, Industry and Land Use in Argentina Today, one of the most important sectors of Argentina's economy is its industry and approximately one-quarter of the country's workers are employed in manufacturing. These "Great Owners" completely controlled local activity and, furthermore, were the principal employers and the main source of wages.
